Basic Principles

Hello again. So are you ready to dive into the relationship compatibility principles and techniques? Yes? Let's go.

In the next pages I want to introduce you to the most important principles you should know to understand the questions you should discuss with your partner and also to be able to figure out the results of what you find out in those discussions.

But before you begin, let's shatter some myths about relationship compatibility and, although I really don't want to offend anyone, but there are some sayings regarding relationship compatibility, which can cause trouble if left alone and not looked into closely.

Here is the list of them:

1. Stars alone can predict a couple's compatibility.

I see, so let's just make a chart and immediately decide, if we can succeed as a couple or not. I'm surely not an expert in astrology, but I prefer a much more educated and responsible approach to that kind of decision, which would not leave another person hurt and with a feeling that he is doomed.

2. Some complicated psychological testing can tell if you are compatible or not.

Modern psychology, as it is taught in universities, is based mostly on statistical approach and testing and not on thorough understanding of human nature. That's why it can only give labels about quite a lot of human characteristics, but can never decide what the person really thinks, would do or would like now or in the future.

3. People never change.

Do you remember any important decision you made in life, which caused you to act upon? Ask yourself: would you act that way before you knew the facts or data that brought you to that decision? I believe you wouldn't? Why would you?

So, giving a good person some very important and profound data about life and behavior CAN change his attitude toward things and people. The only question which remains is: where would you find such knowledge and whether you would do your best to look for it in the case of a need.

4. You should live in a bliss and ignore this subject altogether.

That approach to life tends to cause people the most trouble. Things get worse if left unattended. If you have an illness and decide to ignore it – I doubt it would just get better all by itself, what do you think?

The earlier you take care of a problem as it arises, the easier it can be handled and it can always be handled in some way.

5. There is nothing that can be done about it.

That is simply not true! Relationship compatibility issues can be tested, understood, IMPROVED and even enjoyed on the way. Couples, who are brave enough to tackle compatibility issues as early as possible, enjoy such a deeper understanding and loving relationship that it is astonishing.

As in any good relationship, the key to success is open communication, and there is no better way to open your communication, than talking about important things, that are the core of your compatibility: things you know or experienced, things you like or dislike, things you want to talk about or listen to and things you'd rather not meet in your life.

Having talked about things I do not believe to be true, let's check out simple things that can be done about any relationship to reveal and fix many of relationship compatibility issues.

Common Ground

The most important principle that governs the human relationship health and compatibility and also determines how easily the life goes on for a couple is the principle of finding a common ground.

The idea is to dig out things that you agree upon and also things that your partner agrees upon. But there are thousands of topics that can be checked out. Which do we choose?

Important ones, of course! If you take up your regular week, you know, the week that you live again and again with some slight deviations:

- Mornings – getting up, preparing yourself for the day
- Breakfast – what do you like to eat in the morning
- Work – almost three quarters of a person's life is spent on work, so your preferences, feelings and talks about work are very important to mutual understanding.
- Lunch – again, eating preferences, diet and healthy food
- Evening activities – how do you like to enjoy your free time where do you prefer to go out, if and when do you like meeting your friends, friends of your partner
- Sleeping – going to sleep, having a good relaxing night sleep is important and if anything would keep you from having that, well...

- Sexual preferences – it's a very important part of a healthy relationship, so you better know what you like and what you don't and so about your loved one.

You can add to that additional topics like:

- Financial habits and goals
- Holidays spending preferences and wishes
- Parents - relationship with parents
- Raising children - one of the most controversial area and a topic in itself, isn't it?

So what about all those questions? What to do with them? Well, so what we are looking into here is common REALITY – things that are REAL to you and on the other hand – things that are REAL to your partner.

If you want not to have too many arguments during your life together, you both better AGREE on important things, while understanding your DISAGREEMENTS and knowing that you can put up with them.

To make things easier to understand and talk with your partner, think that most of the things you agree with are based either on your experience or your education, both formal – school, college, other and informal – parents, friends, colleagues.

If you arrive at a disagreement with a person, you can just understand that and even change his mind by finding what the opinion is based upon and check out the source – literature, the Internet, talk to the parents and ask them where their opinions come from and so on.

So, your part here is simple: make a list of important things that you would really like your partner to agree with you and make sure to discuss them with him or her over some period of time, really trying not to argue, but just to get to know the positions of both of you about those important points.

Important Advice: even if you don't agree on many things, having strong feelings toward each other can help you find common ground and decide if it's important to achieve an agreement or you can live with that without much trouble.

Now I'd like to talk about different periods in a relationship and discuss topics, which are relevant to each one.



Dating

During this sweet time you get to know each other and enjoy the mystery of the game called courting. Who would call first, what does every word mean and so on.

But this is the time to start figuring out, if that relationship would be easy and smooth, since you are quite compatible, or some things should be understood and smoothen out first.

One of the most common decisions made is where to go out at night. So many options: cinema or theater, pop or classic concert, pub or restaurant, a party or a friend's house.

In order to make along better, talk about your preferences, don't hold it inside and also don't demand on doing only things you find fun and really enjoyable. A relationship is much warmer when both partners enjoy each other and the company.

So the best is if you really enjoy the same things together and the hardest when tastes are different. But also in the last case, just understanding the differences and bridging them by doing some new things that one partner likes more than other and then switching places, develops a strong feeling of being understood and acknowledged.

Close to where to go comes what to eat – food preferences. Although it doesn't seem too important to me, since everybody can eat whatever he wishes, decisions of to which restaurant to go especially if the food preferences are very different can cause arguments and quarrels too. Again – talking it over and making compromises with later trying new things is the best recipe for a warm relationship.

During first months of dating the hardest thing is to develop a natural, light and interesting conversations, since so many things are unknown to each other and not too many common activities exist yet.

Here I want to suggest a very powerful way to starting on the right foot: ask your partner much more than you tell him or her. It's so easier to be interested in another person, asking all the details about him, his friends, his parents, study, work, hobbies, preferences, that conversation just goes on and on.

On the way you can tell about your part of life comparing to your partner. Ask where he or she studies and then shortly tell about your place, ask about friends and then tell something about your good friend, funny stories come up easily and emotions turn up more and more between you.



First Year Together

As you get to know each other over the first year, and especially if your communication gets deeper and more open, you might already realize where you both stand regarding many of the important

issues and subjects, related to relationship compatibility.

If there are some topics from the dating period discussed earlier not covered yet, I suggest you continue to discuss them over to reach deeper understanding and better compromises between you. Remember, that the more you talk about important issues and resolve them, the deeper are your feelings toward each other and the more chance your relationship has to survive for years.

What I want to add to the subjects to discuss and pay attention too, are:

- Holidays
- Study or work

I believe you had the chance to have a vacation or a holiday together. Did you really enjoy it? This is a very important field of compatibility understanding. How does each of you like to spend his or her spare time, vacations and holidays? Go to country, ski, or, perhaps, stay at home and enjoy some reading, movies, music or idle calm conversations.

Once you talked over and agreed on how you like spend your spare time together, you would understand if you would enjoy being off work together or there are some issues to resolve. Talking things over, and especially and most importantly, trying things together would greatly strengthen your relationship and bring you closer to each other.

After the first dating period, you come back to work or to study and you want to discuss the hours spend on those major parts of our life with your partner. Can you talk about things that matter to you at work or study with your partner? Are you close intellectually?

If not quite, I would strongly suggest doing courses or reading some general literature to grasp the main terms and subjects in what your partner does for a living or studies for future profession.

It is very discouraging and disappointing to understand that as far as your work and study concerns you are alone and your partner just does not understand what you are talking about. It can be such a frustration. On the contrary, knowing that your partner cares enough to make the efforts and understand your life and your world better, makes such a difference and would earn him or her tremendous thanks from you, wouldn't it?

If there are big obvious differences in the intellectual abilities and the less able person cannot see how it can be improved, it could become an obstacle in the future, because straight, open communication on important issues can be hard to have and if so both reality and affection between two people might diminish. It's something to consider for the future.



Mature Relationship

What becomes really important for mature relationship is the matter of parents. Oh, yes. Controversial area of life, I would say. The arguments that might arise can be hard to overcome and easily lead to enmity.

People have very different attitude towards parents, some love them blindly and trust every word and others despise and don't want to listen to them altogether. Those are extremes, of course. And what lies between is the need to go to each other's parents and deal with their opinions.

I do believe, of course that older people have more experience, but that does not necessary says more knowledge or more relevant experience. So in order to prevent parents from becoming an obstacle in your relationship, I suggest three things:

1. Keep warm neutral communication with parents of your partner if any hint of misunderstanding shows up. You can always talk about weather and good roads with them. Thus many arguments can and should be avoided.
2. Try to make friends with your partner's parents by talking about things they agree with and like, thus getting close to them emotionally. It would help your partner and ease your life together.
3. Take only those advices and suggestions from your or your partner's parents, which are based on the exact knowledge in that specific field, especially if that knowledge is strengthened by some relevant experience.

Some people might try to "save" other people from mistakes, when they base their suggestions on fears and rumors only and not on cold facts. It is all too common for an older person to become feared of life and so to try to protect the people dear to his heart by stopping them from doing some uncertain things.

Unfortunately, in order to succeed in any field you might risk and try new things and then you don't need advice based on fear but rather an educated and experienced opinion. Seek those for such cases.

As for parents, try not to talk to them about things that might frighten them and thus you could save yourself and your partner from arguments about what his or her parents said about this and that, and which might bring disagreements and quarrels into your harmony.

Well, aside from such a major subject as getting along with your parents, there are other small topics, which might cause some irritation if not smoothed up in time. I'm talking about living together and sleeping together.

I assume here that you are living together by this time. Living together involves getting to know and putting up with each other small habits:

- How you both look and smell in the morning
- What each of you prefers eating during the day and how that affects the other one
- How you like to sleep and if each other's sleeping habits do not get on the other person's nerve
- How you and your partner dress for work and spare time

- What each of you likes to watch on TV
- And so on and so on...

Although I personally think these are minor things, but I strongly suggest that if something does irritates or makes either of you angry or annoyed, talked gently about it and try to bring matters to mutual satisfaction if possible. But, please, never tell the other one that what he is doing is not right – that doesn't work! And only would bring more arguments.

The way to say it is: look, I would really like you to _____. It would make me so more calm and happy. Can you do it for me? Thanks, you are great! Gentle talk and a lot of admiration toward the other person would make all the difference and would not create any desire to do things on purpose, you know.



Marriage

Congratulations, you are married now! I welcome you to the world of married couples. A person is not whole, it seems, unless he has a family and the marriage is a start for that if taken right.

But what can stay in the way and break the peace? Compatibility issues, of course. And now we have much more issues that should be taken care of.

- Plans for the future
- Finances
- Breaking the routine
- Children

The last point, children I'll discuss in just a couple of minutes, so let's take on the first three.

Planning for the future

In one book I've read, the author said that a relationship is first of all a decision to unite with another person, and from that decision, come others and others. But the main question here is whether you make those decisions once the questions are thrown to you by life or because you have a plan?

I absolutely agree that we cannot plan our life altogether, but having a goal, a way to follow, makes making decisions easier and when the goals, the plans and the ways are agreed upon by two people, making decisions becomes a game, fun to do and real pleasure, knowing that you find support in the most important person in your life.

So to make it happen, you better know your goals, your plans and your future vision. And the best way to decide on those is to discuss them with your partner. Common, try it out and enjoy the outcome.

But remember first to have as many agreements as possible with your partner, and once those agreements are in place, reaching common goals and plans becomes easy and fun.

Then start planning things together as a family, doing things together as a family, enjoying things together as a family. As long as planning, doing and enjoying together continue, you have a family and you are a family.

It's like two ships in the sea – two people would live together peacefully and happily as long as they stay on the common course and arrive at the same time to their destinations as a fleet.

How to do it? Here is the checklist:

- Decide together where you want to see your family in a year, 3 years, even 10 years and later.
- Work out a reasonable plan of actions to bring your family toward the goals you have set earlier.
- Do it! Do the actions planned and adjust the plans for unforeseen changes but don't abandon common goals.
- Don't forget to enter pleasures on the way. Why not to have fun? Enjoy your life, enjoy each other. It should be hard to live, but the happiness must be guarded.

So, what should we plan about? I'll give you some things to think about and discuss together:

- Holidays and places to visit and travel to
- House and car – they might become nice gems in your collection together
- Financial goals – level of income you'd like to achieve together
- Marriage – when and how do you plan to marry if you not married yet
- Children – how many children do you want, how you would like to raise them
- Knowledge – what do you want to learn by yourself, together with your partner
- Spiritual achievements – what do you want to achieve spiritually

Finances

Once you start living together, the subject of finances would eventually and inevitably turn up. Would it be spending on food and clothes, paying rent or buying a house, money for vacations and traveling or simply to which restaurant to go depending on how much it costs.

If a couple has a vast difference in their attitude toward money and finances, there surely would rouse a lot of arguments small and big around this very hot topic. There are just immense amount of reasons why people are so touchy on the subject of money, but it can be summarized to one thing:

"Money means survival!"

When you have money you can be sure you will continue to live, buy food, pay for rent and have all those things that you might consider necessary for your acceptable existence.

Some people think that if they cannot go to a restaurant once a week, the life is miserable and another thinks that if he does not have 100,000\$ in his bank account he is in a serious danger. It really varies among people.

So I would really consider checking things out amongst yourselves to make sure you have enough agreements on finances to be calm about your expenses.

What I suggest discussing:

1. Basic needs

Here we can count food, rent for your apartment, household expenses, car or other transport expenses, and so on. What needs to be understood is just how much should be spent on the mere existence under a roof being fed and being able to go to a work safely.

2. Spare time

What you better discuss is just how often should you go out, eat at restaurants, travel and have good time and especially – how much should it cost? Since these are not basic needs it is often not considered as survival needs but luxury or something that can be omitted.

So you would be better off if you could arrive at a reasonable agreement of how often to go out or go on vacations, where to go and how much should it cost.

3. Spiritual or intellectual needs

Well, this is an interesting subject and I don't want to leave it unspoken of. I personally, believe that a human being has the right to rise as high as possible in his abilities and knowledge and in order to get that knowledge or abilities it is often necessary to learn and study and do things that might cost money.

So after you should have already discussed your personal beliefs and actions related to the spiritual or intellectual growth, I suggest also bringing up in a conversation the cost of it. And especially if it is not cheap, a couple would be so much happier if a calm agreement could be achieved to let each one of the partners spend money for what is important and close to his or her heart.

4. Business

There are those who just go for a work and bring home the salary. Some try to have a career and that way get an increase in income, while others want independence and to own their own business.

Aside from the risks involved in having business, those of having enough paying clients, business often might cost some substantial money especially in the beginning of it – establishing the business, renting an office, paying salaries, marketing, advertising and so on.

I don't for a minute try to discourage anyone from having his or her own business, I think it's fun and very rewarding if done properly and worked on persistently, but any large expenses that are taken from the family or a couple's common finances, must be discussed and agreed upon as soon as they appear on the horizon.

Although the reasons for those expenses might seem too complicated to discuss with your partners, I strongly believe for at least trying to make that decision and agreement for your partner as educated as possible. It is certainly pays off to have an understanding and supportive partner than to feel alone in your business and risks.

5. Investments and future

There are people who leave in today, having money or receiving some specific income like salary. Although there are others who want to have more money that they have right now and so seek ways to make money by saving it or by investing it to make some profits.

As I saw in many cases, people don't invest or are against investments only because they don't know enough about it to feel safe enough talking or dealing with investments.

So if one of you wants to invest for some future profits and another is against, I very much suggest giving some education and some good facts about investing in general and your way of making money in particular.

As a conclusion on these notes on finances, I strongly advice to have calm, educated and factious conversations about anything, that deals with money. People can get angry, irritated, feared and so on talking about this subject. But it has to be thoroughly discussed and quite a lot of important agreements should be set between partners to have peaceful life together.

Breaking the routine

After some period of time living together a couple might feel that they got into a routine, already starting to get boring life. Although they might continue to do the same things together, like going out, meeting friends, parents and going on vacations, some feeling of an adventure gets lost in the everyday life.

You remember, I was talking about a relationship being a chain of decisions, starting from the first one to go out together, the first kiss, the first night together, starting to live together before or after marrying and so on.

Well, I want to add something that I know comes before that decision – the desire to **create** something important and wonderful in one's life. So in order to get out of routine, have more fun together, and even reach another levels of mutual understanding and affection, I suggest...

"Have new games together all the times!"

What do I mean by games? Well, adventures, new ideas being implemented together. For example, buying a new house together, opening a common business, going to travel for a long time, even having another baby - these are all games together.

Games involve goals and obstacles on their achieving and a good game must have an enjoyable goal and obstacles which can be overcome by learning something new and applying the newly acquired knowledge and skills. Even old knowledge or skills already rusty a little when recalled and applied might remind of pleasure in doing something interesting and fun. Especially together!

When you have common goals and do things toward them, you feel more together than ever. So keep inventing new common goals all the time. Never stop on what is, but imagine what would be great to have in the future and just act in the way of achieving it.

Your life would never be boring or routine and you both would all the time have hope for the better tomorrow.

Children

One last but surely not the least subject I want to discuss is children.

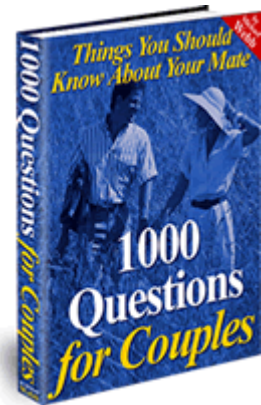

Find Out What a Person Likes and Dislikes

Once you start talking to a person about things that he or she finds important, you would find that the person might become more emotional discussing those topics.

What do I mean by emotional? When one loves or hates, feels strong or mild or no interest toward something, gets angry or even hates and despises things, maybe feels fear or grief those are all emotions that a person can feel toward any specific subject.

The secret of living an interesting, loving, fear free life together, lies in finding out what you and your partner really like or hate, get angry with or feel fear about. If you know those and then do your best to hold on to things, which you both like and find interesting and on the other hand stay away from subjects any of you feel a hard emotion toward, you would have much more control over your emotional life together.

Among several topics mentioned earlier, which require you to sit down together and discuss, there are some, that involve strong emotions and you might feel some unwillingness to do it. Although, I know that it is might be hard to talk about those things, but with enough courage and knowing that you want a great life together that you both deserve, it can and should be done. Said that, you could take it slowly and step-by-step.

Sometimes during your life together, you or your partner could burst with anger or irritation or get frightened or even depressed. The other person might feel that he or she had not known that in his partner and become afraid that

you as a couple might be not compatible at all. That's not true! I strongly suggest to only take into account how both of you behave most of the time and not during the darkest times of our existence, so to say.

In addition to that above, if you could stay away from things that irritate or annoy your partner or yourself, you could avoid a lot of problems and bad feelings and keep the affection, communication and agreements unharmed.

Unfortunately, during those periods, when a person shows hard emotions like anger, fear or grief, he or she might become somehow different and tell you things he or she might not otherwise utter. It should not be taken into account seriously but instead better be understood and only acknowledged. That will keep peace in your relationship and you would gain warm appreciation of your ability to understanding and withstand.

One last suggestion on the subject of hard emotions – when you are arguing or having to deal with another person's anger or fear, you better stay patient and understanding, and not telling the other person that he or she is wrong. Such a wise behavior would leave the other person himself and not invite the worst part of his or her character to awaken and break your agreements and compatibility.

On the other hand if you do your best to communicate on subjects that both of you like and have interest in, your affection to each other would improve and your communication would flow easily and in general your life together would be fun and pleasure.

Base Your Life on Communication

Making Things Happen Your Way

The very last subject I want to discuss, that relates directly to succeeding in reaching better agreements and understanding between you, is actually one of the most important life approaches a person might adopt to his life.

I'm talking about the difference of being a victim versus being at cause over what happens to you in life. For example, you wait for your friend to call you and invite for a nice evening together. And you never call him by yourself.

Now let's assume, he never calls but just because he totally forgot about it, nothing more. But you might think, that you were betrayed, forgotten, not loved and feel real miserable. Feel a victim.

But if you wanted to be at cause, you might have called your friend and ask when he arrives that evening to take you. Everything would be different – evening would be great, you would feel important and loved. You see the difference?

The same applies to relationship. You want to make sure you are compatible and also improve any compatibility issues before any problems appear, be at cause over it! Actively invite communication about important subjects, don't wait for your partner to do it. He may be shy and afraid and nothing more.

One more thing in case you liked the idea of being at cause over your relationship. And that's – how to bring your partner to agree with you merely by communicating with him. It's quite an ability to have, don't you think?

So the way we do it is called "public relations". This term means getting other people approve of your opinions or actions by communicating to them why it is good and helpful what you think or do.

How to do that? Find every fact and leading opinion that supports your way and actions and present it warmly and with good communication to your partner seeking small agreements with you until you both thoroughly agree that your way is good and acceptable to both of you.

For example, you think, that going to a certain movie is a good idea. You don't just say that you want to go to the movie because you think it is a great movie and that's all. No, you can say that some particular well known good actors play in the movie, assuming one of them is favorable to your partner as well. Then you can tell that so and so many people told in favor of the movie and it also has got good reviews. That way you build your partner's appreciation of your recommendation and greatly increase the chance that you indeed will go to that movie together after all.

This way of getting what you want demands some experience, so try it out and enjoy the pleasure of being acceptable to those around you.
